GENERAL RULES:

1. Entries will be received from 7:30 a.m. to 9:00 a.m. Wednesday, August 11, 2010, at the Attala County Coliseum.
2. Exhibits will be open to the public at 6:00-9:00 p.m. Wednesday, August 11 through Friday, August 13, 2010.
3. **Exhibits must be removed between 7:00 and 9:00 a.m. on Saturday, August 14, 2010.**
4. All entries must be checked with Entries Committee and must receive an entry card before being placed.
5. All classes open to residents of Attala and adjoining counties.
6. Only one entry in each class may be made by an exhibitor. Bring a list. (See page 12)

RULES—HORTICULTURE DIVISION:

1. All entries in horticulture classes **MUST** have been grown by exhibitor and labeled as to variety where possible.
2. Containers for specimens will be supplied by Flower Show Committee.
3. Pots with mixed plants are permitted.
4. Potted plants must have been in possession of exhibitor at least 3 months prior to show.
5. **Only one entry of one variety, one color,** from same garden permitted in each class.
6. Any class may be sub-divided by color, variety, or other qualifications when deemed necessary.

AWARDS:

1. Awards shall be given only for quality and if merited.
2. Each class shall be eligible for the following awards:
FIRST ----- Blue Ribbon
SECOND ----- Red Ribbon
THIRD ----- White Ribbon
HONORABLE MENTION – Yellow Ribbon
3. The Sweepstakes Award (rosette with green and white ribbon) will be given to the exhibitor with the most blue ribbons in the Horticulture Division. In the event of a tie, red ribbons will be counted. Blue ribbons count five points and red ribbons count three points.
4. The Horticulture Excellence Award (rosette with orange, green and blue ribbons) will be given to the horticulture exhibit judged best in the show.
